What's happening in marine research along our 13,500 kilometre coastline?

The Western Australian Marine Science Institution (WAMSI) and the Australian Marine Sciences Association (AMSA) are holding a symposium to answer that question.

Senior scientists will outline what research is happening and why, covering areas from the Kimberley in the State's north-west to the southern coasts stretching to Esperance and beyond.

They will be supported by scientists from public agencies, private organisations and academic institutions who will provide brief 'newsflashes' about what they're doing and the results so far and about what they're planning to do.

Their research is vital to answering questions about the survival of coral reefs, climate change, the future of marine species, food webs, fisheries, tsunamis, extinctions, warming temperatures and ocean acidification – to name just a few!
